The Historic Elk Landing Foundation, in partnership with the Historical Society of

Cecil County and the Archaeological Society of the Northern Chesapeake (ASNC), present, “**A Report of the Elk Landing Field Session**” with archaeologist Dr. James Gibb. Dr. Gibb, who helped lead the field session that discovered Fort Hollingsworth, will speak starting at **7 p.m. on October 10th** at the Historical Society of Cecil County, located at 135 East Main Street in Elkton. Archaeological Society spokesman, Dan Coates, said the location selection was made to accommodate the anticipated large turnout.

“The Elkton venue will accommodate the Cecil Historical Society membership, the Elk Landing Foundation, the Archeological Society of Delaware, and ASNC members of that area,” according to Dan.

Admission is free and open to the public.

Meanwhile, analysis of all the materials discovered at Elk Landing surrounding both the discovery of Fort Hollingworth and prehistoric Native American artifacts, continues. Those materials include pictures taken of every artifact removed from the site. Dan says Archaeological Society’s Bill McIntyre will be “busy scanning photographic material from the Hollingsworth Farm Site 18CE29 (Elk Landing), for a few more weeks.”
